• Enabled to identify and classify the research material on women's professional education development issues in Ukraine


Extrapolation method









Peculiarities of women's professional education development in Ukraine

The presence of multilevel, multidisciplinary, seasonal women's professional schools with full-time and part-time forms of education

Functioning of professional educational institutions for different segments of the population, disadvantaged children, representatives of national minorities

Lagging behind the professional education of men

Functioning of mostly private women's and co-educational men and women professional schools

Availability of an extensive network of professional education institutions for women, sometimes without statutes and clearly defined rules, qualification levels of specialists
